The community itself must also be given an understanding that the age of the mine industry is limited, so if the mining economy stops, they are ready and more prepared to have another source of income. This of course also requires good cooperation between the company and the government and other stakeholders in order to achieve one of the indicators of good mine closure, which is the good condition of the community that are left behind by the mining company.

The conclusion is very relevant for coal mining companies to start planning for early mine closure (mining for closure), where there will be assessment of initial conditions, risks and impacts in the future, especially in the final condition, it will be very important, be it on business, operations, environment, or society and other stakeholders. One of the suggestions "Thinking about the end before you start: is one way of integrating sustainability thinking in the planning process as a good and responsible company.

## **Woven Pandan Training**

The department of Labor and Industry (Disnakerind) of Tanah laut Regency in collaboration with PT Jorong Barutama Greston (JBG) conducted webbing training using pandan, on 28-31 ocober 2019 in Swarangan Village, participated by 20 women.

The trainer was brought in directly from Yogyakarta, Mr. Sutaryono Hasan Basri from CV Yudha Handy Craft. At the opening ceremony, the Chairperson of the CCC Sub-District currently also Jorong District Secretary, Drs. H. Lalu Takdir said that many panda leaves grow in Swarangan, this matter becomes good support in the availability of raw materials, it does not require large expenditure to make the webbing, nature has provided it for free. He also thanked JBG for organizing the training program.

Meanwhile from JBG, represented by Erna Puji Purwanti, said that the purpose of the training in making woven pandan leaves is to increase the insight and improve the knowledge of mothers to help the family economy. This is because generally when the economic conditions decrease, usually the ones that can survive are small businesses, including this panda leaves crafts.

## Karjo Craft, a Variety of Products Made of Sasirangan

Karjo Craft is a branda carried by an UKM group that has consistently been activated by 5 housewives from Banjarsari Sub-Village, Karang rejo Village since December 2018. Created from Sasirangan fabric, the types of products produced by the group are quite diverse. Started from various types of women's bags, office supplies such as agendas, stationery cases, laptop bags, to other household equipment such as tablecloths, tissue holders, and many more.

Karjo craft was created by the initiative of Pt Jorong Barutama Greston (JBG) to develop small businesses in the community around the company. Previously, operating in the same industry, which is producing sasirangan fabric, the Sasirangan Karang rejo grop has stopped the production of Sasirangan due to internal group problems. Facilitated by JBG, the group then given training for new crafts together with other housewives around the area, that is making new products using sasirangan fabric. The Sasirangan Karang rejo group then transformed from producing sasirangan fabric to creating products made from Sasirangan fabric.









This time the marketing is still on the scale of local market. Sasirangan fabric is a special fabric from South Kalimantan with historical value. This fabric is commonly used by ordinary people and aristocratic people during traditional ceremonies. Nowadays, along with times and changes, sasirangan fabric is made into various products such as clothes, bags, shoes, and many more stuff for daily use.

As a company committed in empowering communities around the mine area, PT Jorong Barutama Greston (JBG) noticed that sasirangan have economical value also owns cultural heritage that needs to be preserved. Departing from these thoughts, the sasirangan home industry program is now being promoted again.

This is also the aspirations of the people and the government of Karang rejo Village who want sasirangan to become a product that has value and can compete in the market, said Arid Munandar, S.Kom – the Karang Rejo Village Secretary. Besides that, the existence of the sasirangan group is expected to support the development of sasirangan product that has already developed in Karang rejo Village in terms of supplying raw material products.

On August 27-29, 2019, JBG facilitated a training program in making sasirangan products for 10 members of the Karang Rejo Village PKK group. The majority of the

participants are housewives. At the end of the training, Sri (Rhadita Sasirangan) who is a training instructor said the participants were quite capable in terms of choosing motifs of fabrics and also choosing colors. Continuous practices will improve their capability in technical dyeing.

After the training, together with the Chief of Karang Rejo Village PKK group, Sri Nova Saupani, and the participants come to an agreement to create a small business group called Gressari.

### **IMM Teaches** UNMUL Students





PT Indomico Mandiri (IMM) received a student visit from the Faculty of Forestry of Mulawarman University (UNMUL) on Thursday, November 21, 2019. A group of 65 semester VI students and 2 accompanying lecturers were received by the IMM management (Zainal Abidin Aplatun Management Representative, Rahadian Purnama AMM & FA Head, Taryono HSEC Head, Hafizh Reza GS Head, Comdev Team, Operation Team, and HRD Team) which were conducted at the White Building.

The visit was one of the activities agenda of the Environmental Impact Analysis (EIA) course. The Head of the Group and the Supervisor of the EIA Forestry Study Program led by Dr. Emi Purwanti, M.Sc., thanked the IMM management who were willing to provide knowledge to the students regarding the EIA. It is felt to be useful to add insight and new knowledge in field practice and see first hand the application and implementation of EIA in the Mining area.

The Head of Mining Engineering (Summit), Era Tjahya Saputra explained that for IMM, this visit was a part of IMM Teaching program at the Faculty of Forestry at Mulawarman University which introduced Good Mining Practice in implementing EIA in the area of the company and students could gain field experience and mining knowledge. In addition, Zainal Abidin Aplatun also explained that IMM had implemented the Reclamation Guarantee (JAMREK), Watershed (DAS), and corporate social responsibility (CSR) activities as part of the company's compliance with environmental and social regulations.

At the core learning event, Dwi Darmadi as the resource person presented material about the mining business process in the IMM area relating to licensing, regulation,





mining processes from the beginning of the IMM to the present, and the application of AMDAL (EIA) in the mining area. Besides being filled with questions and answers, the group was also invited to the location of the mine site to see first hand the implementation of the mine in the field.

## **"PAUH" Chicken Breedes Group** Utilizing the Solar Electricity



PT. Jorong Barutama Greston (JBG) succeeded in implementing solar electricity installations on community-owned chicken farms that were built by the company.

This success is the result of collaboration between the Department of Community Development, Maintenance and Environment by installing solar cells that produce solar electricity for PAUH group's chicken farms.

The electricity generated uses the principle of land energy belonging to PAUH group members, which was established in 2012. Currently the group's production has reached 45,000 chicken.

Since it was installed until June 2019, electricity savings were recorded at 11.67 GigaJoule or almost reached Rp. 4.5 million. The use of conventional electricity which is slightly in operation has reduced emissions that pollute the air. According to Rasmat Riadi, JBG CD Officer, the breeders have reduced the burden of air pollutants (emissions) by 2.9 Tons of CO2 Eq.

"This is a form of JBG's commitment to meet compliance with applicable regulations," said I Gede Widiada, the KTT JBG. He added, that this breakthrough was an effort by JBG to encourage the formation of community independence, so that the economy in the community could be relied upon even after the mine closed.

### **Cow Breeding using UPSUS SIWAB Technique**

PT Kitadin Site Tandung Mayang (KTD TDM) conducted Technical Guidance (BIMTEK) for Cattle Livestock Maintenance at BPU Building in Suka Damai Village, Teluk Pandan Sub-District, December 12, 2019, the program is called "Catte Breeding using UPSUS SIWAB Technique to increase Animal Population and Livestock Feed Forage Development (HPT)". This Technical Guidance was attended by farmers from 4 (four) villages in the District of Teluk Pandan (Martadinata Village, Suka Rahmat Village, Suka Damai Village, and Danau Redan Village).



What is UPSUS SIWAB? UPSUS SIWAB stands for Special Efforts for Obligatory Breeding Cows which is one of the program from the Ministry of Agriculture to accelerate in order to improve the population of cattle in a sustainable manner by maximizing the potential of broodstock cows in producing more calves. The UPSUS SIWAB activities are:

- The implementation of IB activities (Artificial Insemination)
- Provision and Distribution of frozen semen, Liquid Nitrogen (N2) and Containers
- 3. Feed Forging Fulfillment
- 4. Managing Reproductive Disorders
- 5. Control of Cutting Productive Female Cows

The participants owned these skills through the speakers from UPT P4 Teluk Pandan District. So that the farmers have better ability and skills to develop their cows in the future. The IB activities are an alternative if the breeders are still difficult to mate naturally, then the IB can accelerate the process of cow production.

### **Seven Ways to Prevent Diseases Due to Flooding**

Handling and preventing flooding is very important for everyone. Although some post-flood hazards are short-term hazards, but many cannot be considered insignificant. ### 1. Clean yourself and your surrounding environment

#### 2. Manage your Food and Diet

The easiest way to regulate consumption and eating patterns is to increase the consumption of water. So, always make sure to have clean water at home and sufficient for all of the family members throughout the flood season. If possible, always consume fruit and vitamins to maintain your body and your family's immune system, ok!

### 3. Get a Vaccine for Hepatitis A

The best result is to have your body vaccinated before the disaster. But if it has not been done, vaccinating your body with Hepatitis A after the flood is better than nothing. This step is needed especially for those who have a high level of interaction with flood water and sources of dirt.

#### 4. Prevent Malaria and Dengue Fever

After the flood, many places will definitely leave water puddle. These places are certainly a comfortable breeding ground for Malaria mosquitoes.

Therefore, be sure to pay attention to water puddle around the house so that it is not used as a means of breeding mosquitoes. You can eradicate it by spraying insecticide or other types of anti-pest medicine.

### 5. Improve Sanitation Around the House

Poor sanitation can be the source of germs and diseases that are very dangerous for the body. After the floods, make sure to check and clean sanitation around the house to avoid danger and diseases caused by flooding.

#### 6. Consume Clean Water

After the flood, usually you will have difficulty having clean water supply, especially clean water from the ground. As much as possible try to only consume clean water for bathing, cooking or drinking. The goal, of course, is to prevent you from various diseases caused by floods that spreads and are very dangerous to your health.





#### 7. Provide Health Education

This last step should be conducted from the beginning in order to become a provision for your family in dealing with floods. Health education related to floods includes safe food preparation techniques, ways to maintain health, and how to take care of the environment. You can find out about health education about flooding from the internet or by asking for help from the health department and other related agencies.

In addition to the 7 preventive steps above, you can also try to apply some of the following simple suggestions recommended by WHO.

- · Always use clean drinking water
- Drinking water must be boiled first or chlorinated
- Consumption of oral rehydration salts to treat dehydration
- · Use antibiotics to treat a variety of bacteria
- Take analgesics to prevent fever
- · Always wash your hands with soap before eating
- Always wash clothes after flood with clean water

Besides the methods above, it would be better if you are always alert after the flood. If you feel you have a problem, do not hesitate to ask for help from health workers or from the authorities.
