Comparative Study on Successful Learning in Balikpapan

In line with the spirit of empowerment at the encouragement of the government's regulations (Permen ESDM 1824, 2018), PT Trubaindo Coal Mining (TCM) - increasingly enhances the empowerment of education that has been running in 20 of its target villages, one of which is the empowerment of the ability of teachers from Elementary School 004 in Muara Lawa by facilitating comparative studies activity of successful learning in Balikpapan. Elementary School Patra Darma 1 -Balikpapan is the location of comparative study, is an excellent school that has performed and received international awards.

A lot of positive knowledge and skills were received by the teacher of Elementary School 004 team in Muara Lawa, namely teaching and learning, administration, treatment of parents / guardians of students, philosophy of school, forms of fa-

cilities / props, school support facilities, and others. So the teacher team was excited to adjust the application at the Elementary School 004 Muara Lawa.

After completing the comparative study, it began to feel there was a gradual change in the application by the teacher in the school. This activity does not only bring benefit for the teachers and schools, but also for TCM who support education, and local government in the field of basic education. The gradual changes include:

1. Positive communication that started with parents / as the students representative, where the teacher's recommendation - (school) that enforces the rules so that all students must bring their own supplies. (previously there were no rules to bring lunch). If you buy food in the school canteen,

you have to eat it in the classroom during breaks and monitored by the teacher. Students are accustomed to praying before eating food so that a sense of togetherness is created, reducing shopping habits, facilitating food monitoring, and instilling good character for students, to sharing and care for one another.





2. Has begun to be instilled - the habit of greetings and respect to the teachers. (previously - there are no mandatory rules of greeting and respect for teachers on a daily basis). So that this rule is implemented by students who usually give greetings and respect to parents when leaving home, continued if at any time, entering the school and come home from school, they must greet their teachers and say their greetings, good morning and good afternoon. Students are increasingly sensitive and controlled.

Students become better acquainted with their teacher through positive interactions. (Previously there was no obligation to greet and greet the teacher).

This new habit is slowly creating an order of regularity behaviour in school. Teachers of Elementary School 004 Muara Lawa expressed their deepest gratitude to the TCM for supporting the comparative study and application in schools.

PT Trubaindo Coal Mining (TCM) develops the community economy through the formation of the Meseseq Lestari Fisheries Group. Moves in catfish farming, located in Mendika Village. Since it started, it has grown 6,000 seedlings of various types of fish (Tilapia, Patin, Catfish). Special Catfish has been harvested Up to 2,000 fish. To maintain stock (fish stocks), the group distributes seedlings to members, so that the supply of fish for the market will be well maintained.

As company workers and as citizens of the community, we were created by God blessed with conscience, so that we have good qualities in accordance with nature such as caring, honesty, acting justly, and not selfish. Our presence in the community should not damage and harm others but provide sincere love so that life becomes meaningful and benefits the environment. PT Kitadin Embalut (KTD EMB) - as a place of work and a place to partner with the community, is one of the means in achieving many hope and wishes.

Expectations after mine closure are automatically the company’s hopes and the people’s expectations. Communities around the mine can develop sustainable livelihoods. The village is a source of production that the people should be able to

enjoy. If the village has become a source of livelihood for its community, then after closing the mine, the community can continue to live with the strength of natural resources owned and supported by many productive human resources

Mine closure, of course the road will not be very easy. So, the main thing that is important to do is to equate common perceptions and commitments, without it, sustainable life is difficult to make it happen. The EMB KTD, villages and their target communities need to unite in empowering steps and be ready to enter the mine closure.

Empowerment according to Scheyvens (2002: 60), regarding the Empowerment of Community Framework, explains there are four things that must be considered in community empowerment, they

are:

- 1. Economic Empowerment** where post-mining programs provide sustainable benefits to the community around the mine. In addition, the benefits of program beneficiaries can be felt by each household that has been empowered, this can be demonstrated by a sustainable program.
- 2. Psychological Eempowerment** with the empowerment of communities around the mine in the development, then each individual indirectly feels an improvement in their self-esteem through the introduction of customs, culture, and natural resources and knowledge about the outside world. In addition, an increase in the social status of individuals after the opening of access to employment
- 3. Social empowerment,** an Improvement in social life of the community through the efforts undertaken by each family and individual who supports the program
- 4. Political empowerment,** Political Empowerment (political empowerment), every structure and political layer of society is shown by the desires and needs of all groups of people involved so that all groups feel the benefits. Those community groups are





a group of women known as PKK, a young group known as Youth Organization, and many others.

The effort made to carry out a community empowerment requires several components, as follows (Pitana; 2011;6):

1. **Enabling**, which is creating an atmosphere so that the local community is increasingly empowered.
2. **Motivating**, which is motivating the community to be motivated to participate.
3. **Educating**, namely raising public awareness to know what is happening and realizing the importance of a development program.
4. **Encouraging**, which is encouraging people to be motivated to participate in every development process.
5. **Protecting**, means protecting weak community with various protection policies and strategies, not allowing it to compete in the free market.
6. **Empowering**, means increasing

the potential and capability of the community to play a role in development.

7. **Opportuning**, which is developing opportunities / chances so that the community can participate more.
8. **Devoluting**, giving up some authority to the community so they can make their own decisions.

Communities must have the abilities and expertise to support their involvement in empowerment development, in other words through empowerment process we will be more empowered, so we can design the future and prepare for their abilities, and will be able to walk on their own after the mine closes.

The future if the community has worked with each other, synergized with each other, and collaborated with each other to make a positive impact, then future generations and their work will become something meaningful for the village. Something that has great significance for the village in the future.
