Tasting the Sweetness of Kelulut Honey Cultivation

Through the PPM program in Economic Independence sector which has been agreed by the Separi Mahakam Village government, PT Kitadin carries out a community empowerment program economic improvement through the procurement of 30 boxes of Kelulut Bee colonies (Trigona Itama).



Kelulut Honey is known as an excellent anti-inflammatory and antibacterial for wound healing and inflammation. In addition, Kelulut Honey also has very high levels of antioxidants.



This program was developed because the development of Kelulut Honey production has a fairly good

opportunity. The price of Kelulut Honey itself is relatively high and the sale is easier than other bee honey. This is because Kelulut Honey offers more benefit for health than other honey. Kelulut Honey is known as anti-inflammatory and antibacterial which is very good for healing wounds and inflammation. In addition, Kelulut Honey also has very high levels of antioxidants. Antioxidants are believed to ward off free radicals to prevent aging and cancer. Kelulut Honey is also relatively low in carbohydrates compared to other honeys, due to its high water content. Therefore, Kelulut Honey can be recommended for diabetics who want to consume honey.

In the future, this program is expected to have an impact on improving the economy for the community, especially the Kelulut Honey bee farmers in Separi Mahakam Village. Through this honey kelulut program, it is hoped

that Separi Mahakam Village can become a pilot program for the development of Kelulut Honey in other Kitadin assisted villages.

PT Kitadin Improves the Quality of Human Resources in the Fostered Area

In order to improve human resources in the fostered villages of Ring 1, namely Bangun Rejo Village, Embalut Village, Kerta Buana Village and Separi Mahakam Village, PT Kitadin implemented a Welding/Welder and Wheel Mechanic training program. This program start from early March 2021, with a training duration of 20 days. The training participants consisted of 24 participants who were divided into 2 training programs.

SMK Negeri 2 Samarinda and SMK Istiqomah Muhammadiyah 4 Samarinda, became partners of the company's cooperation in fostering the participants of this training. The two schools collaborated in presenting school teachers as trainers. Not only

receiving knowledge to increase competence, participants also receive psychological guidance from instructors appointed by the company. SMKN 2 is the center for welding training, while SMK Istigomah Muhammadiyah 4 focuses on training two-wheeled mechanics.

With this training program implemented by PT Kitadin, participants are expected to be able to follow the learning materials and practices correctly, so as to increase the bargaining value of participants which will have an impact on economic improvement later.

PT Indominco Mandiri together with CSR Forum Contraktor and IMM Taklim Council





PT Indominco Mandiri (IMM) together with CSR Contractors Forum, PT Pamapersada Nusantara, and the IMM Taklim Council regularly held Ramadan Safari activities every year. This time, the Ramadhan safari activity was filled with the distribution of basic food assistance and medical kits for the poor in 11 villages around the company's operations which were divided into East Kutai Regency, Kutai Kertanegara Regency, and Bontang City. The aid was also distributed to several Tahfizh Islamic boarding schools, orphanages, and nursing homes.

HSEC Head IMM (Health, Safety, Environment, and Community), Mr. Taryono said that the Ramadhan 1442 H Safari activity was combined with the

distribution of basic necessities and medical kits of 2,200 packages. The medical kits that were distributed contained vitamins, masks, and hand sanitizers that were useful for preventing COVID-19. In addition, there was also a donation of 66 million rupiah which was intended for 11 mosques in villages around the company. TIE DYE AND ECOPRINT TRAINING Empowered Women, Improved Economy

The absence of a small and medium business unit targeting Housewives and Women of productive age in Benangin Village is one of the reasons for BEK to initiate Tie Dye and Eco print training skills improvement activities. Tie Dye which in Indonesian is known as the technique of dyeing, tying, and



dipping cloth, is found in various motifs of traditional regional fabrics in Indonesia. This coloring art is often called Batik, Jumputan, or Sasirangan, depending on the naming of each region.

Tie Dye motifs are currently very popular and favored by both teenagers, children and adults. The coloring technique using the Tie Dye method is also very easy to apply. The craftsman group only needs fabric dyes, white t-shirts/fabric materials and an introduction to how to tie to get various motifs. While most of the Tie Dye coloring techniques use fabric dyes from chemicals, in this training BEK also facilitates participants to get to know how to dye fabrics using the Eco print technique. This technique is more focused on the use of natural materials as the basic ingredients of fabric dyes.

Benangin Village currently has a lot of potential if you want to develop an Eco print business because it has various types of leaves and woody trees as a source of raw materials. With abundant raw materials, community groups in Benangin can provide product selling prices that are competitive with Eco print

persons and trainers from Fanesya Sasirangan, one of the SMEs from South Kalimantan Province who had previously known and sold Tie Dye products.

BEK hopes that this training can have a positive impact, where the skills provided as business capital can be used to improve the family's economy.

Tie Dye market share is more general, because the price of the product tends to be affordable. Meanwhile, Eco print has a more specific target market. Because it is made from natural elements, this product is very popular in foreign markets. The more unique the leaf shape and color on the fabric, the more expensive the selling price of the product will be. Ecoprint fabrics ready to sell with cotton, silk or leather can reach prices ranging from Rp. 500,000, - to Rp. 700,000, -.

This training activity was held for two days on April 7 and 8, 2021, involving 27 participants consisting of housewives and several students from Benangin I, Benangin II, and Benangin V villages. This activity was opened by the Manpower Office, Transmigration Cooperatives and SMEs. As a form of concern for education, PT Indominco Mandiri (IMM) again held the Indominco Teaching program through the Webinar "BEING A CREATIVE. INNOVATIVE, and PRODUCTIVE TEACHER" targeting schools, involving elementary, middle. vocational, high school MAN teachers in Marangkayu, Pandan Bay, and Bontang area. The program aims to develop the capacity of teachers in the target areas. The Indominco Teaching program is the implementation of the PPM program in the education

sector for 2020-2021. The COVID-19 pandemic has

made the implementation of the 4.0 education revolution in society inevitable. The school's obligation to carry out Distance Learning (PJJ), requires teaching staff to be technology literate so that the

teaching and learning process to be implemented without obstacles.

The COVID-19 pandemic brings benefit for the implementation of the 4.0 education system for educators and students who are familiar with digital technology, so that it can make it easier for them to go to the transformation phase from conventional to online. IMM TEACHING PROGRAM (PPM Program for Institutional Sector)

Simple Bookkeeping Training in 11 IMM Fostered Villages

PT Indominco Mandiri (IMM) again held the Indominco Teaching program through simple bookkeeping training. This activity collaborates with the Finance & Accounting department as a form of volunteering for employees in the comdev program.

The establishment of Village Owned Enterprises (BUMDes) aims as a locomotive for local economic development at the village level. This village economic development is based on the needs, potential, capacity of the village, and capital participation from the village government in the form of village financing and wealth, with the ultimate goal of improving the economic level of the village community. The basis for the establishment of BUMDes as the locomotive of development in the village is based on the initiatives of the government and village communities based on cooperative, participatory, transparent, and accountable principles to the community. With these principles, it is the obligation of BUMDes to always increase the capacity of its management on a regular basis, especially expertise in bookkeeping and reporting. This basic need causes BUMDes management to make this training program a top priority in developing BUMDes.

The activity was attended by HSEC Head Mr. Taryono, teaching team from IMM teaching program,

FA Head Mr. H. Adi Wijaya, CD Head Mr. Sujarwanto, CD advisor Imam Taufik, Team CD and 10 fostered BUMDes and 1 LPM with representatives of 2 people from each BUMDes and LPM. In the training, HSEC Head, Mr. Taryono, conveyed the concept of implementing the IMM CD based on the PPM that had been prepared from the annual plan. Where the development of BUMDes is one of the programs on the pillars of empowering local institutions in the assisted villages. So that the formation of a professional BUMDES becomes one of the outputs or outputs of the program that is highly expected by IMM.

The training activities ran smoothly and all BUMDes daily administrators were very helpful in the implementation of the training in the preparation of these financial reports. The obstacle previously faced by the daily management of BUMDes was the lack of knowledge about financial management so that the use of the bookkeeping format was very simple and did not comply with reporting standards. Through this Indominco Teaching program activity, BUMDES management is expected to be able to make financial reports that comply with generally accepted accounting standards.



IMM TEACHING PROGRAM (Program PPM for Independence)

Millennials in Today's Era are Working in 4.0



As a form of concern for the Micro Business world, during this pandemic, PT Indominco Mandiri (IMM) again conducted the Indominco Teaching program for students and lecturers through the "MILLENIALS ZAMAN NOW BERKARYA" (Millennials in Today's Era are Evolving) Webinar program at Mulawarman University and Samarinda State Islamic Institute. This activity was enthusiastically welcomed and attended by 679 participants, while 8 representatives from the IMM team attended. This webinar discusses student challenges for the future, especially in Era 4.0.

This program is an implementation of the PPM program in the field education with the theme of entrepreneurial economic independence. This theme was chosen as a form of IMM's concern for the economic independence of the millennial generation which is full of new challenges, but also has new opportunities if it can hone creativity as well as possible. In this activity, participants received motivation about entrepreneurship mental education, insight, and soft skills for millennials. It is hoped that the millennial generation can become advanced youth, have a strong mentality and be able to become wise leaders. In addition, not to be a generation that has spoiled attitude.





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The program does not only have one-way education, but also a place to exchange knowledge and experience.

This program is one of the community development programs that involve employees as volunteers. In the Indominco Teaching program this time, apart from involving the department for volunteering





(represented by Mrs. Hainun), IMM also invited speakers from outside, namely Master Core Brain and International Coach by Kak Stevie Lengkong.

Mr. Taryono as HSEC Head said that this activity is to increase students' awareness that when they graduate from school or college, they will face rapid developments in technology and quite competitive competition in the world of work. Therefore, as early as possible students must be aware and sensitive to developments that are quite stringent by increasing the capacity and quality to compete. If you are currently relaxed or don't care about the issue, then it is likely that you will be left very far behind. Currently, humans are not only competing with fellow humans, but also have to compete with technological capabilities. So it is hoped that this activity will build the enthusiasm of students to compete, especially for final semester students who will be dealing with the world of work in the near future.





If you have food waste, vegetables, fruit, even leaves/other organic waste, don't throw it away! Because this waste can still be made into compost which is very useful for plants in our garden. This will really help you to save on the cost of buying compost for plants, because you can make your own in a very easy way! The existing waste is simply collected in



a tub and given a solution of bio composter or EM 4 and brown sugar, then left for several weeks until the waste turns into compost for fertilizer in our own gardens.

To increase the price of existing waste savings, we can try to raise black soldier fly larvae. Processing organic waste with a bioconversion process using black soldier fly larvae can produce animal or animal feed that is high in 44.26% protein (medpub.litbang. pertanian.go.id) and amino acids, known as Maggot. Not only become Maggot, the remaining waste can be used as Organic Fertilizer (Kasgot).

Kasgot BSF (Organic Fertilizer)

This fertilizer is the result of bioconversion of organic waste using Black Soldier Fly (BSF) larvae. Black Frasster consists of BSF larvae feces and decomposed organic waste cellulose, with a dark brown blackish fine grain texture. Black Frass is an









environmentally friendly fertilizer because it is made from a 100% natural process, without a mixture of chemicals.

Seeing the amount of organic waste that exists, the Kitadin Comdev team up together with the community and try to use the waste into Maggot and Kasgot. Waste processing and management, apart from being able to increase income, it can bring more important positive impacts, including:

- 1. Forming awareness and concern for the environment. As we know, participating in protecting and preserving the environment is a form of awareness, concern, responsibility and gratitude for the blessings of Allah SWT in the universe.
- 2. Helping local governments reduce the volume of waste dumped into garbage collections.
